### **Mass Meeting**

Electing Delegates to the State Convention  
Emporia/Greenville Republican Committee

As Chairman of the Emporia City and Greenville County Committee of the Republican Party of Virginia, and pursuant to the Plan of Organization and as recommended by the Committee, I, **Fred Maldonado**, do hereby issue this call to elect delegates to the **May 8, 2021** State Convention at which candidates for Governor, Lieutenant Governor, and Attorney General will be selected between **9 am and 4 pm**.

### **Qualifications for Participation**

All legal and qualified voters of Emporia City and Greenville County under the laws of the Commonwealth of Virginia, regardless of race, religion, national origin or sex, who are in accord with the principles of the Republican Party and who, if requested, express in open meeting either orally or in writing as may be required, their intent to support all of its nominees for public office in the ensuing election, may participate as members of the Republican Party of Virginia in its mass meetings, party canvasses, conventions or primaries encompassing their respective election districts.

### **Filing Requirements**

Those wishing to serve as delegates to the State Convention shall file the form available at Virginia.GOP, which must be received no later than **April 7, 2021, 11:59pm**.
