

OFFICIAL CALL

Mass Meeting of the King George County Committee Of the Republican Party of Virginia

As Chairman of the King George County Republican Committee of the Republican Party of Virginia, and pursuant to the Plan of Organization and as recommended and directed by the Committee, I, Jeff Bueche, do hereby issue this call for a Mass Meeting to be held at the Hanover Baptist Church, 10312 Hanover Church Road, King George, Virginia 22485 on March 24, 2022 starting at 6:00 PM for the following purposes:

- 1) Electing a Unit Chairman;
- 2) Electing members of the Unit Committee
- 3) Electing up to three hundred and fifteen (315) Delegates and an equal number of Alternates to the Republican Party of Virginia's 7th Congressional District Convention to be held at Caroline High School, 19155 Rogers Clark Blvd. Milford, Va 22514 or its alternate site, starting Saturday, April 9, 2022 at 11 a.m. with registration beginning at 8 a.m. for the following purposes:
 - A. Electing a Chairman for the 7th Congressional District of the Republican Party of Virginia
 - B. And for the transaction of such other business as may properly come before the Convention.
- 4) And for the transaction of such other business as may properly come before the mass meeting.

For the District Convention, each unit is entitled to one (1) Delegate Vote per 250 Republican votes cast or major portion thereof for the Republican candidate in the most recent elections for President and

Governor, so that King George County is entitled to sixty-three (63) Delegate Votes.

Qualifications for Participation

All legal and qualified voters of King George County, under the laws of the Commonwealth of Virginia, regardless of race, religion, national origin or sex, who are in accord with the principles of the Republican Party and who, if requested, express in open meeting either orally or in writing as may be required, their intent to support all of its nominees for public office in the ensuing election, may participate as members of the Republican Party of Virginia in its mass meetings, party canvasses, conventions or primaries encompassing their respective election districts.

In addition to the foregoing, to be in accord with the principles of the Republican Party, a person otherwise qualified hereunder shall not have participated in Virginia in the nomination process of a party other than the Republican Party in the last five years. A single exception to the above shall be approved for a voter that renounces affiliation with any other party in writing, and who expresses in writing that he/she is in accord with the principles of the Republican Party and intends, at the time of the writing, to support the nominees of the Republican Party in the future. A voter that utilizes the foregoing exception, and thereafter participates in the nomination process of a Party other than the Republican Party, shall not have the benefit of the exception as identified in this paragraph thereafter. In order to be eligible for election as a Delegate or Alternate Delegate to any convention, an individual must be registered to vote no later than the pre-filing deadline established by the Official Committee. A person who has made application for registration and meets all other requirements herein, but whose name does not appear on the local registration books solely because of the books having been closed in connection with a local election, will nevertheless be deemed a legal and qualified voter.

Filing Requirements

Candidates for the election of a unit chairman shall file a written statement by mail or in person, with a registration fee of \$100.00 (non-refundable and payable to King George Republican Committee) to Robert Stevenson, 7201 Kitchen Drive, King George, Va 22485 which must be received not later than March 18, 2022 at 5 p.m. Postmarks do not govern. If only one candidate properly files, then said candidate shall be declared the chairman.

Candidates for election to the positions of member of the King George County Republican Committee and/or Delegate (or Alternate) to the April 9, 2022 7th District Convention must submit the filing form found on the Republican Party of Virginia website (RPV.org) which states intent to seek election for each specific position and which will include name, address, phone number and e-mail and voluntary fee (if applicable) All statements must be received not later than 5 p.m. on March 18, 2022 either in person or by mail (postmarks do not govern) at the following address: Robert Stevenson, 7201 Kitchen Drive, King George, Va 22485.

If the number of persons properly prefiled as candidates for any office to be elected at the mass meeting does not exceed the maximum number that can be elected, then all properly prefiled candidates shall be deemed elected and no vote will be held for that office. Further, if the number of persons properly prefiled for all offices to be decided upon by the mass meeting does not exceed the maximum number that can be elected, the mass meeting will be canceled.

Registration and Fees

There will be no registration fee to participate in this mass meeting. and a \$5 voluntary registration fee to participate in the 7th District Convention. Note-Failure to pay the requested fee will not result in disqualification.

I hereby file my candidacy for Membership to the King George County Republican Committee. A \$40.00 fee is required for the two year membership.

I hereby seek election as a Delegate representing King George County at the 7th Congressional District Convention to be held on April 9, 2022 at 11:00 a.m. at Caroline High School, 19155 Rodgers Clark Blvd. Milford, Va 22514 (A voluntary fee of \$5 is requested.)

Paragraph 1, Article I of the Republican Party of Virginia State Party Plan states the following--All legal and qualified voters under the laws of the Commonwealth of Virginia, regardless of race, religion, national origin or sex, who are in accord with the principles of the Republican Party, and who, if requested, express in open meeting either orally or in writing as may be required their intent to support all of its nominees for public office in the ensuing election may participate as members of the Republican Party of Virginia in its mass meetings, party canvasses, conventions, or primaries encompassing their respective election districts

Paragraph 2, Article I-A voter who, subsequent to making a statement of intent, publicly supports a candidate in opposition to a Republican nominee shall not be qualified for participation in party actions as defined in Article I for a period of four years.

Paragraph 4, Article I-In addition to the foregoing, to be in accord with the principles of the Republican Party, unless otherwise stipulated by the appropriate Official Committee, a person otherwise qualified hereunder shall not have participated in Virginia in the nomination process of a party other than the Republican Party with in the last five

Paragraph 5 Article I-A single exception to Paragraph 4 shall be approved for a voter that renounces affiliation with any other party in writing, and who expresses in writing that he/she is in accord with the principles of the Republican Party and intends, at the time of the writing, to support the nominees of the Republican Party in the future. Any voter that utilizes the foregoing exception, and thereafter participates in the nomination process of a party other than the Republican Party, shall not have the benefit of the exception identified in this paragraph thereafter. Within 30 days of receipt, the Official Committee shall provide a copy of this signed renunciation statement to the Republican Party of Virginia, to be maintained for a period of 5 years.

Article VII, Section C of the Republican Party Plan of Organization states the following about membership on a county committee: A member of an Official Committee is held to a higher standard of support for nominees of the Republican Party than an individual who merely participates in a mass meeting, party canvass, convention or primary. Therefore, a member of

an Official Committee is deemed to have resigned his Committee position if he (a) makes a reportable contribution to and/or (b) allows his name to be publicly used by and/or (c) makes a written or other public statement in support of a candidate in opposition to a Republican nominee in a Virginia General or Special Election.

By signing this form, I certify that I am a registered voter in King George County, have read and understand the requirements above and that I intend to support all nominees of the Republican Party for this election during my two-year term as a member of the King George County Republican Committee.
